Drill two holes through the face of the door where you've made the marks. Remove any wood shavings. Now slide the lock mechanism into the hole, place the latch plate over it and screw into place. Next, place the handle and thumb-turn through the holes and secure them with screws. That's the bathroom lock sorted.
