

Can Timor-Leste generate electricity?

Did East Timor have a low electrification ratio?

Even then, East Timor had the second lowest electrification ratio of Indonesian provinces. The events of 1999 resulted in widespread destruction of almost all power sector assets, including administrative buildings, power stations, power lines, and associated records and documentation.

How will Jatropha impact Timor-Leste's energy sector?

To have a meaningful impact on the energy sector, the government of Timor-Leste will need to look at Jatropha programs that are capable of providing a uniform fuel type throughout the country, thus one of the programs-- B5 through B20--for biodiesel.

Is wind power economic in West Timor-Leste?

A USAID-funded wind project has been on going in the "NTT Province" of Indonesia that also includes West Timor. Based on West Timor data, this study concludes that wind power is probably not economic in coastal areas, but it may prove to be economic in the uplands and mountains of Timor-Leste both for grid connected and off-grid applications.

Did East Timor have a wind station?

During 1992-1995 four masts in East Timor collected surface wind data for the Indonesian Meteorological Institute. The sites were all coastal: Dili, Baucau, Comoro, and Oecussi. Maximum mean wind speed at 24 meters was 4.3 meters/second. Neither the stations nor records appear to have survived.

How many households in Timor-Leste have access to electricity?

As noted earlier, only 20% of households in Timor-Leste have access to electricity. The Government intends to address this situation in the decade ahead with a sustained program of rural electrification.
