What is a microgrid energy system?

A microgrid is a self-sufficient energy system that serves a discrete geographic footprint, such as a college campus, hospital complex, business center or neighborhood. Within microgrids are one or more kinds of distributed energy (solar panels, wind turbines, combined heat and power, generators) that produce its power.

Microgrids can also help to support the integration of renewable energy into the main electrical grid, promoting a more sustainable and efficient energy system overall. Thus, microgrids are an important tool in the efforts to create a low carbon future and a more sustainable energy system.
